

## President's Report

The 2023-2024 Season was, as Leila remarked throughout the season, one of the greatest we've ever presented. There were Vancouver and Canadian debuts, we welcomed diverse audiences who were attracted to some of the more 'out of the box' concerts, and we presented a rich program of outreach, an element of our programming which doesn't get as much public attention, but of which we are tremendously proud.

The season began in September with BC-born pianist Jaeden Izik-Dzurko at the Vancouver Playhouse. During the early days of the pandemic in 2020, Jaeden recorded what was the VRS's first ever virtual performance, which was made available to the public free of charge on our YouTube channel. Jaeden is a wonderful representation of what the VRS is most renowned for – spotting young talent at its earliest stages and offering an established and respected platform to showcase that talent. This past fall, Jaeden won the prestigious Leeds International Piano Competition and was recipient of the Dame Fanny Waterman Gold Medal.

October was a busy concert month during which we welcomed Swiss pianist Jean-Sélim Abdelmoula in his Vancouver debut, Canadian duo Cheng<sup>2</sup>Duo featuring siblings Bryan and Silvie Cheng, and the return of British cellist Sheku Kanneh-Mason, who made his sold-out Canadian debut for us in 2017 and has returned several times since, much to the delight of Vancouver audiences.

In November, violist **Timothy Ridout** made his Canadian debut alongside pianist **Jonathan Ware** (who has been to the VRS several times), and pianist **Tony Siqi Yun** returned, following his incredible VRS debut in 2021.

In the first part of 2024, we delighted in the return of a few artists we haven't seen in a good number of years. In January, the **Sitkovetsky Trio** returned to the Playhouse 11 years after their VRS debut, and, in February, we presented Spanish pianist **Javier Perianes**, who has visited the VRS several times since his debut in 2008, but whom we hadn't heard since 2017.

The spring was decidedly busy, with more debuts! Cellist **Jonathan Swensen**, whose father **Joseph Swensen** — a noted violinist and conductor who performed for the VRS in 1985 — made his VRS debut when he performed with violinist **Stephen Waarts** and pianist **Juho Pohjonen**, both of whom have appeared on our series before). Israeli pianist **Ariel Lanyi** made his Canadian debut in March, and Canadian-Macedonian mezzo-soprano **Ema Nikolovska** appeared alongside renowned Canadian pianist **Charles Richard-Hamelin**, marking VRS debuts for both. Australian violinist **Christian Li** rounded out the month with his Canadian debut at the Playhouse, with pianist **Rohan De Silva**.

April was filled with wonderful and diverse performances from the Manchester Collective, who appeared with South African cellist **Abel Selaocoe**, The **Danish** 



String Quartet who, alongside Finnish cellist Johannes Rostamo, completed the 4<sup>th</sup> and final installment of their *Doppelgänger* series, countertenor **Jakub Józef Orliński** & **II Pomo d'Oro**, violinist **Daniel Lozakovich**, who made his Vancouver debut with VRS favourite, pianist **Behzod Abduraimov**, and Italian pianist **Federico Colli**, who made his VRS debut.

The season ended on a high note in May, with **Paul Lewis's** 4-concert Schubert Sonata series.

In addition to all of the wonderful performances at the Playhouse and the Chan Centre in this season, we presented our most robust season of outreach, with two Classics for Kids concerts, one Music for Munchkins presentation in collaboration with the Vancouver Public Library, a workshop with students at Killarney Secondary and a performance for the residents of Crofton Manor retirement community.

Throughout our 44-year history (we're now in our 45<sup>th</sup>), the VRS has had a devoted family of sponsors donors and supporters, to and for whom we are deeply grateful.
