It's hard to believe that 2025 marks the 30th anniversary of the establishment of the Jerusalem Quartet. Since their first appearance for the VRS in 2001, this ensemble has become a regular and beloved presence on the world's great concert stages. They have appeared many times in Vancouver, and a highlight in the annals of the VRS was their 5-concert performance of all the Shostakovich String Quartets in the Telus Theatre at the Chan Centre in 2006. They are returning to us to perform the same program they played in their Wigmore Hall debut 25 years ago, an appearance which launched them to international fame.

Icelandic pianist Víkingur Ólafsson has become one of the world's most sought-after artists in recent years, capturing the public and critical imagination with profound musicianship and visionary programs. His recordings have led to over one billion streams and he has won numerous awards, including the 2025 GRAMMY for Best Classical Instrumental Solo for his recording of Bach's *Goldberg Variations*, BBC Music Magazine's Album of the Year, and the Opus Klassik Solo Recording of the Year (twice). He makes his VRS debut with a deeply personal program, "Opus 109", centred around Beethoven's sublime Piano Sonata No. 30.
