

A SEASON OF **WOW!**



Dear Friends,

Welcome to our 43rd Season! Its announcement has garnered more exclamations of "WOW!" than I have ever heard before. It is a season of 'firsts', not only in terms of debuts, but also in terms of the music you will hear and the venues at which we present.

J.S. Bach looms large; the season begins with his last work, *The Art of Fugue*, which will be performed by the celebrated young Italian pianist **Filippo Gorini**. You will also hear two entirely different performances of Bach's *Goldberg Variations*. The first will be the resurrection of our 'Going for Gold' concert with **Sir András Schiff**, which was to have taken place in our 40th Anniversary Season in 2020. (Sir András will also perform a second concert at the Vancouver Playhouse where he will reveal the program from the stage).

One month later, we shall hear the remarkable young French harpsichordist **Jean Rondeau's** take on the *Goldberg Variations* at Vancouver's Beth Israel Synagogue, where the acoustics are remarkable. And we are delighted to welcome **Midori** to the Playhouse for an evening of Bach and works she has commissioned for a tour that celebrates her 40-year career.

We have an entire concert of Vivaldi from the wonderful **Jupiter Ensemble** — with mezzo-soprano **Lea Desandre** — in their first North American tour, and, for the first time we shall present an entire concert of Mozart Sonatas by **Mao Fujita**, a young pianist who truly has the measure of Mozart (and a name to remember!).

The **Danish String Quartet** return for the third concert of their Schubert-themed *Doppelgänger* project, and we welcome back the **Chiaroscuro Quartet**, whose 2021 concert was one of the many casualties in a season of cancellations. Speaking of a season that "wasn't", we are thrilled that we have been able to reschedule performances for the young pianist **Tom Borrow**, whose career is soaring, and Italian pianist **Andrea Lucchesini**. And we're delighted that the **Ukulele Orchestra of Great Britain** has been rescheduled and will now appear at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre.

Cello fans take note: **Steven Isserlis** returns to our stage with his long-time musical partner, Canadian pianist **Connie Shih**, and we have two fine young cellists whose stars are on the rise: **Zlatomir Fung**, who will make his Vancouver debut alongside pianist **Benjamin Hochman** (who has appeared on our series in the past), and **Jamal Aliyev**, who will make his Canadian debut with the renowned Turkish pianist **Fazil Say**.

Violinist **Randall Goosby** makes his Canadian debut with pianist **Zhu Wang**, and baritone **Benjamin Appl** is closing out the season with **James Baillieu** at the piano. If these marvellous offerings aren't enough to increase your heart rate, we have a once-in-a-lifetime performance from the **Kanneh-Mason family** — **Sheku** and **Isata** return to Vancouver to perform at the Orpheum with their five siblings.

Much as we would love to release tickets for the entire season now, we cannot begin to guess what the pandemic will throw at us in the coming months. So, we have decided to sell tickets to the fall concerts only for now. Tickets to the second half of the season will go on sale in November. We have listed the performers appearing in the Winter-Spring Season on page 9. Save the dates and save the money!

We look forward to sharing some truly great performances with you!

Filippo Gorini is a singular young pianist. He made his Canadian debut on our series in 2019 with a fascinating and fulfilling program, and his post-concert chat and Q&A were riveting. Luckily for us, during the Covid-19 lockdown he turned his probing intellect and musical curiosity to uncovering the message in J.S. Bach's last composition, *The Art of Fugue*.

Filippo's 2020 recording for Alpha Classics of Bach's masterpiece of counterpoint kicked off a multi-year project funded by the Borletti -Buitoni Trust. As part of the project, he is releasing a number of filmed conversations with personalities such as Frank Gehry, Alfred Brendel, Peter Sellars and Sasha Waltz. The VRS audience will have access to some of these films and will hear Filippo introduce the project in a pre-concert presentation, and then, after the performance, he will open up the discussion and take questions from the stage.


JAMAL ALIYEV cello FAZIL SAY piano

Jean Rondeau made a huge impression on the VRS audience in 2018 when he performed at our 'Surprise Concert' in the Telus Studio Theatre at the Chan Centre. The 30-year-old Frenchman has gone on to become a veritable superstar and a global ambassador for the harpsichord, described by the *Washington Post* as "a master of his instrument with the sort of communicative gifts normally encountered in musicians twice his age."

"An ode to silence" is how Jean has described Bach's *Goldberg Variations*. "I feel they were written for silence, in the sense that they take the place of silence," he says. "All Bach is there in the *Goldberg Variations*... all music is there... and I will no doubt spend my life working on them."



American violinist Randall Goosby came to our attention when he won First Prize at the 2018 Young Concert Artists (YCA) International Auditions in New York. Since then, his career has gone into orbit: he signed a recording contract with Decca Classics in 2020 and was awarded a coveted Avery Fisher Career Grant in 2022.

A protégé of the legendary violinist Itzhak Perlman, Randall is acclaimed for the sensitivity and intensity of his musicianship alongside his determination to make music more inclusive and accessible, as well as bringing the music of under-represented composers to light. For his Canadian debut, Randall will partner with pianist Zhu Wang, a YCA artist celebrated for his "technical mastery and deep sense of lyricism" (The Durango Herald).
