There is no shortage of incredible piano talent on offer... from the masterful virtuosity of **Minsoo Sohn** to the power and panache of **Behzod Abduraimov**; the refined elegance of **Leif Ove Andsnes** and **Paul Lewis** to the probing intellectual curiosity of **Filippo Gorini**. We can delight in the skill and dynamism of **Lucas and Arthur Jussen** and experience the joy of discovering ascending newcomers such **Mishka Rushdie Momen** and **Lukas Sternath** in their Canadian debuts.

And we have a few of 'out of the box' performances that we think are going to generate great excitement, including the genre-defying Scandinavian ensemble **Dreamers' Circus** (whose founding member is Rune from the Danish String Quartet), and the fascinating partnerships of mezzo-soprano

Ema Nikolovska and guitarist **Sean Shibe**, who bring 'Orlando' to our stage, and baritone **Benjamin Appl** and accordionist **Ksenija Sidorova**, whose 'Breath and Bone' program will surely captivate.

There are some stellar string players, as well. We have welcome returns from violist **Timothy Ridout**, who will perform with pianist **Federico Colli**, and violinist **Stephen Waarts**, who will join forces with pianist **Juho Pohjonen**. And we have the Canadian debut of violinist **Chloe Chua**, who will partner with pianist **Mario Häring**. On the cello front, we have **Luka Coetzee**, who will make her VRS debut with a VRS veteran, pianist **Jon Kimura Parker**, and **Jonathan Swensen**, who returns to our stage with pianist **Juho Pohjonen**.

Minsoo won the Honens International Piano Competition in 2006, and shortly thereafter played Bach's *Goldberg Variations* at one of our annual 'Surprise' concerts. He has held teaching positions at Michigan State University, the Korean National University of Arts (where he taught superstar and compatriot Yunchan Lim) and he is now back at his alma mater, the New England Conservatory of Music where, as a student, he was guided by the late Russell Sherman and Wha Kyung Byun.

Our relationship with Paul Lewis is quite special. He has performed on the VRS stage more frequently than any other performer, going back to the early days of the Vancouver Chamber Music Festival. Paul has given memorable performances of the complete cycles of Beethoven and Schubert Piano Sonatas and he returns with his latest project, a multi-season series titled **Mozart+**, which he'll be playing in venues around the world over the next couple of years. In this series, Paul juxtaposes Mozart's lesser-known piano repertoire with works by composers such as Mendelssohn, Poulenc, Chopin, Weber, Copland and more, illuminating Mozart's enduring influence throughout the generations. Since her professional debut at the age of 11, this Canadian-South African cellist has performed as a soloist with orchestras in Europe and in South Africa. Luka won the Paulo Cello Competition and received First Prize at the Pablo Casals International Award competition. In addition, she graduated from the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto with First Class Honours in Piano.

Jon Kimura Parker is no stranger to Vancouver audiences. He was born and raised here, studying with Keiko Parker and Edward Parker, and then Li Kum Sing at the Vancouver Academy of Music. He was accepted into Juilliard to study with the legendary Adele Marcus and, in 1984, was the first Canadian to win the First Prize at the Leeds International Piano Competition. A bit of VRS history: as a result of that win in Leeds, the VRS rented the Orpheum Theatre for the very first time and presented him in a gala homecoming concert.

Orlando: Songs About Love and Identity from Dowland to Dylan

Two of the most imaginative and daring artists of their generation craft a genre-defying program titled 'Orlando', which traces the legendary troubadour's journey across centuries and continents, from the medieval *Chanson de Roland* to Ariosto's epic poem, and Virginia Woolf's groundbreaking 1928 novel. This bold and imaginative program explores themes of love, conflict, and identity, weaving together works by Schubert, Glanert, Adès, and others, alongside newly-commissioned pieces by Sasha Scott and Cassandra Miller.

Ema describes the Orlando project as: "Courtly love, conflict, identity, adventures traversing time and space, and the role of song, the life of the troubadour in the middle of it all - the fascinating, gallivanting, and almost science-fiction characters of Orlando from Ariosto's *Orlando Furioso* and Virginia Woolf's *Orlando* are at the heart of this program."

As a child, Lukas Sternath travelled the world as a member of the famed Vienna Boys' Choir. He studied piano at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Vienna, and then completed his master's degree at the University of Hanover, where he was Igor Levit's only student. He also studied with Paul Lewis, and further mentors include Till Fellner and Sir András Schiff. At the 2022 ARD Music Competition, Lukas caused a sensation when he swept the board, taking home the First Prize as well as seven special prizes including the Audience Prize. He has been both an ECHO Rising Star and a BBC New Generation Artist. Audiences have marveled at the freshness of Sternath's artistry and his "uncanny gift of communicating through the piano as if it were a tuneful cello" (The New York Times). Over the past several years, we have tried to bring Mishka Rushdie Momen to Vancouver for her Canadian debut, and each time we were thwarted by the pandemic. Finally, this season she joins our wonderful roster of musicians. Mishka captivates audiences with her refined and expressive playing. She studied with Joan Havill and Imogen Cooper at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and has taken lessons with Richard Goode and Sir András Schiff at the Kronberg Academy. Her latest recording, 'Reformation', presents the works of William Byrd, John Bull, Orlando Gibbons, and Jan Pieterszoon Sweelinck performed on the modern piano. The album was described in The Times' selection of the best releases of 2024 as a "triumph" and topped the classical charts.

Daring virtuosity and a gloriously free spirit are among the attributes with which 19-year-old Chloe Chua has won critical plaudits and audience ovations. The Singaporean violinist began playing at just 4 years of age, and captured international attention when she became joint winner of the 2018 Yehudi Menuhin International Competition for Young Violinists. Her stunning musicality despite her young age has captured the hearts of audiences around the world. For her Canadian debut, Chloe joins forces with German pianist Mario Häring (replacing Julien Quentin), who came to prominence in 2018 by winning Second Prize at the Leeds International Piano Competition. He also received the Yaltah Menuhin Award for the best chamber-music performance in the semi-final.

After his stunning appearances in our 3-concert Schubert Affair in the 2025-26 Season, baritone Benjamin Appl returns to the VRS. This time he will partner with another VRS alum, accordionist Ksenija Sidorova, a genre-defying and boundary-crossing artist who has redefined what her instrument can do on the world stage. Together, they have put together a stunning program which they have titled:

Breath and Bone: A Folk Life in Song

This concert is a journey through a human life, told in song. It moves from cradle melodies and youthful longing to love, loss, and farewell, guided by music shaped by folk traditions and their many echoes. The program brings together works by Brahms, Schubert, Britten, Mahler, Rachmaninov, Weill, Brel, and others.

In the intimate pairing of baritone voice and accordion, the music stays close to the body — shaped by breath, memory, and the human need to sing. Across languages and generations, these songs reflect what connects us all: tenderness, longing, and the shared pulse of human life.

Dreamers’ Circus has become one of the most acclaimed and adventurous acoustic bands to emerge from Scandinavia. The talented trio includes a face that will be familiar to VRS audiences – violinist Rune Tonsgaard Sørensen of the Danish String Quartet. Blending Nordic folk with classical lyricism, jazz improvisation, and pop energy, the trio creates a sound that is both rooted and forward-looking, and one that is underpinned by their virtuosic musical abilities across a diverse range of instruments that include violin, fiddle, accordion, piano and cittern. What they offer is new, genre-defying and exciting. The artists themselves say:

We are often asked what kind of music we play. Even if it is music that does not readily lend itself to instant classification, we try and encourage people to view it as something that can transcend genres. Perhaps it is no bad thing to defy classification now and again. So while we share a love of folk and traditional music, and play quite a bit of it still, there are strains and influences from so many other music forms in what we do.

It has taken us a few years to find a mutually-suitable date for their Vancouver debut. Mark your calendars!

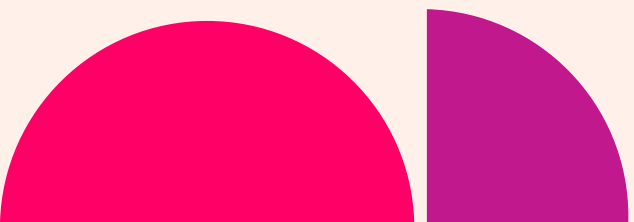
